#### **Description**

Learn to compose using spontaneous design. We will “slash” to cut our fabric and “burn” it through the sewing machine while we combine and recombine a set of fabrics, then use that remade fabric as a springboard for dramatic and dynamic composition.

This class will show you techniques for adding to the composition in floating areas, cutting curves and piecing, as well as a quilt-as-you-go process for building the piece. Be prepared for quick and active “spontaneous” design as you learn how to compose in a direct way. This workshop focuses on composition, how to read elements for line, contrast, repeat, and value. Sewing skills are what you bring to the class, so quilters at all stages are welcome to enjoy this workshop.
